Description:

The Department of Mechanical Engineering at Dalhousie University was not always at Dalhousie University. The Technical University of Nova Scotia (TUNS) merged with Dalhousie University in 1997 becoming the Faculty of Engineering.

Prior to 1997, TUNS was the degree-granting institution for Engineering in the province of Nova Scotia. However, it was named TUNS in 1980. From its founding in 1907 (classes were first offered starting in 1909), until 1980, it was known as the Nova Scotia Technical College (NSTC). Mechanical Engineering was offered as a discipline within NSTC and the department officially opened within TUNS in 1962.

It is situated on the Sexton Campus of Dalhousie University, named in honour of Mr. Frederick Sexton, the founding principal of NSTC. The campus was former military land, and for that reason, military instruction was part of the curriculum until 1945.

Further archives can be found both in the Faculty of Engineering (and its library) and within Dalhousie (and its more general library). These contain much information about the early days of NSTC, then TUNS and finally Engineering within Dalhousie.
